DESCRIPTION

The Farmers' Museum is one of the country's oldest living-history museums. Through demonstrations and interpretive exhibits, the Museum depicts the interplay among trades, village life and agriculture in a New York State agrarian society of the 1840s. The activities and rhythms of everyday living, from broom making and weaving to milking cows and blacksmithing, serve as windows to the past in a superb historical reconstruction that fascinates adults and children alike.

DIRECTIONS

The museum is located 1 mile north of the Village of Cooperstown on State Route 80 on the west side of Otsego Lake. It is a regular day stop on the Cooperstown Village Trolley route. If you are on foot, the museum is a 1.5-mile walk from the village of Cooperstown. There is a sidewalk on the left side of the road heading out of the village, and a pedestrian crosswalk at the entrance to the Museum.
